



Gateways Jewish Education Programs 2019-2020

TAGG (Torah, Avodah, G'milut Chasadim at Gateways)

For Students ages 5-13

Structured and individualized Jewish education classes with 1:1 support by a teen volunteer under the supervision of a highly qualified teacher. Classes are experiential and provide students with a strong foundation in both Hebrew and Jewish studies. This program is designed for students who are pre-b'nei mitzvah, and students who are participating in the Wednesday B'nei Mitzvah class.

Offered on Sundays 9:30-11:00am

B'nei Mitzvah Academy

For Students ages 11-14

A two-year program that includes weekly individualized tutoring sessions, group classroom activities and t'fillot (prayer services). An on-site special educator customizes the lessons and Gateways staff collaborates with congregations throughout the b'nei mitzvah process.

Sunday class meets 9:30-11:00am

Wednesday class meets 4:30-6:00pm

Mitzvah Mensches Learning Lab

For Students ages 13-18

For students who are post b'nei mitzvah, this class provides an opportunity for continued Jewish learning with 1:1 support and focuses on "social action through social interaction". Inspired by the Gateways Mitzvah Mensches program, students will explore themes of philanthropy and social justice while working in an inclusive class environment.

Offered on Sundays 12-1:30pm

TORCH (Tikkun Olam at Rosh Chodesh)

For Students ages 13-16

A social skills group for teens ages 13-16 that meets once a month on Wednesdays 6:30-8:00PM

While exploring opportunities for social action, teens will work on conversational, friendship and problem-solving skills. This group is designed for students with solid verbal language skills who struggle with social skills.

Offered on Wednesdays 6:30-8:00pm

For students post high school...

A goal of the GJEP program has been to provide high-quality, specialized Jewish education for school-aged children. As part of an ongoing conversation about how to help our students transition into young adulthood, Gateways and Yachad have been working together to plan for appropriate programming for students who are now eighteen and post-high school age. For any families that are not already connected with Yachad, we will facilitate an introduction to Liz Offen, the executive director to help make this transition an easy one. More information about programming for students eighteen and over will be coming from Yachad shortly.

Payment instructions

For your convenience, the four payment options from the enrollment and tuition contract are listed on the next page. We suggest that you make a note of which option you selected and retain it for your records.

Policies

1. Gateways classes run on a school year basis, generally from September through May. Staffing decisions and other financial commitments are made for the entire school year. Therefore, partial-year enrollment is not available; enrollment in a class is a commitment to pay the class tuition for the entire school year.
At the same time, Gateways recognizes that the population we serve is particularly subject to unpredictable circumstances. If an unforeseen situation arises during the school year and Gateways determines at its sole discretion that continued participation is not in the best interests of the family, then Gateways will determine a prorated tuition and refund the difference.
2. If space remains in a class and a new student enrolls after the start of the academic year, Gateways will determine a prorated tuition.
3. Tuition will not be reduced for student absences or class cancellations for reasons such as inclement weather.
4. A \$50 per student early enrollment discount is applied if enrollment is completed by June 21, 2019 in compliance with the instructions on the enrollment and tuition contract.
5. In the event of a withdrawal by July 31, 2019, Gateways will refund the total amount paid minus a \$50 administrative fee.

Please select from the following payment options. These are the **only** payment methods which qualify for the early enrollment discount. Any alternate arrangements add to Gateways' costs and therefore do **not** qualify for the discount.

One payment

1. Enclose a check payable to Gateways in the amount of your total tuition (**\$_____**).
2. Early enrollment discount: If this signed form and your check are postmarked by June 21 you may subtract \$50 per student from your payment.
 Optional: Check here to waive your discount and make it a tax-deductible contribution to Gateways.

Deferred payment

1. Enclose a check payable to Gateways in the amount of 50% of your total tuition (**\$_____**).
2. Enroll in FACTS to authorize one ACH payment from your checking or savings account in February 2020 (5th 20th) for the balance. FACTS does not charge a fee for one payment. Early enrollment discount: If this signed form and your check are postmarked by June 21 **AND** your FACTS enrollment is completed by that date, you may subtract \$50 per student from your payment.
 Optional: Check here to waive your discount and make it a tax-deductible contribution to Gateways.

Quarterly payments (\$21 FACTS fee)

1. Enclose a check payable to Gateways in the amount of 25% of your total tuition (**\$_____**).
2. Enroll in FACTS to authorize three ACH payments (5th 20th) from your checking or savings account as detailed below. A \$41 fee will be charged by FACTS but Gateways will refund \$20.
November 2019: 25% of total tuition minus \$20 refund of FACTS fee
February 2020: 25% of total tuition
May 2020: 25% of total tuition
Early enrollment discount: If this signed form and your check are postmarked by June 21 **AND** your FACTS enrollment is completed by that date, you may subtract \$50 per student from your payment.
 Optional: Check here to waive your discount and make it a tax-deductible contribution to Gateways.

Monthly payments (\$41 FACTS fee)

1. Enclose a check payable to Gateways in the amount of 20% of your total tuition (**\$_____**).
2. Enroll in FACTS to authorize eight ACH payments (5th 20th) from your checking or savings account as detailed below. A \$41 fee will be charged by FACTS.
October 2019 through May 2020: 10% of total tuition each month (**\$_____**)
Early enrollment discount: If this signed form and your check are postmarked by June 21 **AND** your FACTS enrollment is completed by that date, you may subtract \$50 per student from your payment.
 Optional: Check here to waive your discount and make it a tax-deductible contribution to Gateways.
